

Progress with my MGB.

In an effort to reduce the likelihood of the rear window in my hardtop from blowing in to the car, as has been regularly occurring, I tried an experiment with adding some triangular stiffeners to hopefully hold the rubber from being pulled out of the hardtop, by the flexing of the Polycarbonate window, and ultimately entering into the back of my car.

I haven't yet been able to successfully install the locking rubber into the window sealing rubber. Well "Success" as on return from Lochinvar after Xmas-in-July I travelled on the bypass motorway at 100kmh (Less than the speed limit) and the window stayed in place!




View of four stiffeners spaced out for maximum effect.

Unless they are using their "Non MG" car and then they will be awarded points for the "Non-Marque Clubman" award.




MGCCHR Vice Presidents report for August 2024






From my point of view it was great to get back on a race track, (it's been a while) and the first couple of runs down the main straight it was obvious what 30 more horsepower can do for you.

The car felt great however that was to be short lived because after the first

few runs and about halfway down the main straight again the car started to pop & backfire, so it was back to the pits to investigate what had happened. A compression test revealed a blown head gasket between cylinders 1 & 2 so that was it for the day onto the trailer and back home. Disappointing I must admit but when you play with old cars and stretch them to the limit you can get problems.



I've since removed the cylinder head & after some intensive checking come to the conclusion that it is just a gasket failure, which is disappointing considering we used a good quality gasket, so we'll have another go with a different gasket. Thanks to Matt Blanch for his help checking it out & confirming my diagnosis.

Over 80 cars competed in the "GEAR" day & I assisted "GEAR" President John Dall to do some random scrutineering checks. He commented on the high quality & presentation of the cars competing which is great considering there seems to be cars we haven't seen before turning up at each meeting and "GEAR" continues to flourish.

It is great to see these historic cars being driven as they were meant to be and not left locked up in a garage rotting away.

Sunday 11 August will see round 7 of the State Hillclimb Championships run at "MGCCN Ringwood Park" and that is definitely worth having a look at with the best hill climbers in the state competing.

A Visit To The Mid Murray Classic Car Gallery

Heather and I recently had a week down in SA, taking a cruise on a Murray River paddle-wheeler with some Family. Our boat stopped off at Swan Reach, which is about 2 hours from Adelaide by car (2 ½ hours via the Barossa Valley), where we had some time to see the town before lunch. Some people wandered off to the Pub, some to the shops or the Museum, but a few of us went to the Mid Murray Classic Car Gallery near the wharf.

This small private gallery holds around 12-15 cars and entry is by a \$2 donation. There's a small shop with die-cast models, some postcards and a library of books to browse. The fellow who runs it said that people borrow the books and post them back when they're finished. It's that sort of laid-back and friendly place.

Some of the cars are on loan, including a pair of MGs. One was a 68' MGB Roadster in Indigo Blue and the other was a near-cousin to my Miss Scarlett, being a 62' MGA 1600 MkII. I can't recall how close the chassis numbers were, as I forgot to take a pic under the bonnet. The fellow who runs the gallery is very happy to open a door, or pop the bonnet for you to take a closer look at any of the cars.

WELCOME TO ALBURY-WODONGA

They're waiting for us in Albury-Wodonga and they've been very patient. Originally the venue for the pandemic-cancelled 2020 National Meeting, the twin cities on the Murray will finally welcome us for Easter 2025. The meeting runs from 18 to 22 April.

We've got a great program of events and venues in mind and planning is well advanced.

THE PROGRAM

To get things started, we will be using a venue in Wodonga called The Cube for our Noggin 'n' Natter and Rocker Cover Racing. You will know how to find it on Friday evening because you'll have been there for Registration and Scrutineering earlier on Good Friday.

The Concours will take place on Easter Saturday at Gateway Lakes Park, on the Victorian bank - rive gauche - of the Murray River. It's a great open space with plenty to do after you've checked out all the cars. There's some boutique shopping and refreshment venues at the nearby Gateway Village, along with nature walks along the river bank. Food and coffee vans will be available on the concours site too.

Saturday night will be theme night at Albury's Commercial Club. The theme for this year will be *Flappers, Gangsters and All That Jazz* - celebrating a time when the only MG you could buy was a new one, when clothes were classy and the music was hot. So let's celebrate the 1920's in style.

Once the theme night has concluded, the scenic roads, hills and valleys of the region will provide everything a sporting motorist could wish for. The area is replete with historic towns dating back to the gold rush. The scenic Murray River, the Hume Weir and winding country roads, including the longest remaining section of the old Highway 31 running through towns complete with period shops.

What could be better for the Sunday Kimber Run and Monday Discovery Run? Be ready for a walk through some of these historic towns to answer the Discovery Run questions, have a refreshment and soak in the atmosphere.

Sunday will also be Motorkhana Day and the patterns will put all of our memory capacity to work once again. We are still selecting a venue for the motorkhana and will update entrants when a selection is finalised.

Monday will be Lap Dash/Sprint Day at the Logic Centre driver training facility in Barnawartha, a short drive south of Wodonga. This is a great facility with a challenging track and will provide plenty of fun for our competitors and spectators.

Monday night's presentation dinner will be held at the SS&A Club Albury, which will also be the venue for the traditional farewell breakfast and delegates meeting on Tuesday morning.

DINKY SNIPPETS. "The Guy Trucks and Vans"

The Guy Company was formed in 1914 in Wolverhampton, producing mainly trucks and buses and trolley buses. Surprisingly it also made some saloon cars, about 150 with V8 engines! It was a company that really looked after its workers, having a cricket ground, football field and bowling green on site. It was in production until 1982 when it was absorbed by Leyland. Prior to that in 1961 it had got into financial problems due to opening a branch in South Africa which was a loss making enterprise and was bought at the bargain price of 800,000 pounds, by Sir William Lyons who controlled Jaguar and Daimler. At the time, the Labour Government of Harold Wilson was encouraging mergers to solve the financial problems of the motor vehicle companies and Jaguar merged with BMC to form British Motor Holdings which then combined with British Leyland to form the huge conglomerate of British Leyland Motor Corporation. The Company had intended closing down the Guy Motors subsidiary in 1975 but the trucks (Big J) were selling well and it continued production until 1982.

The Dinky models included the Guy Vixen series and the Guy Warriors. The first production was in 1947 Guy Lorry numbered 511 and labelled Dinky Supertoys. Possibly the first "Supertoy" which were the bigger models. This is the grey one in the picture with four sides on the tray. It was followed in 1947 by the Guy Flat Truck (512) and the Guy Flat Truck with Tailboard (513). The numbering is very confusing with the numbers changing twice, to 911, 912,913 in 1954, and 431, 432, 433 in 1955! The vans were based on the same Vixen chassis and were initially all numbered 514 with advertising for "Slumberland", "Lyons Swiss Rolls", "Weetabix" and "Spratts" released between 1949 and 1954. Subsequently "Ever Ready" and "Golden Shred" were added. The only one I have is the Slumberland in red pictured. The decals state "Slumberland (regd) SPRING INTERIOR MATTRESSES" with the Royal Crest and "Slumberland Ltd by appointment bedding manufacturers to H.M. THE KING". It is hoped that George VI slept well!!

Subsequently the first Guy Warriors were released in 1958 with a Flat Truck (No 432), and a van in 1960 "Heinz 57 Varieties" with a bottle of Tomato Ketchup on the decal (No 920).

The model of 432 shown with the box was recently purchased from Ben Ben Models in China, a perfect reproduction with the inscription on the base shown in the photo,



MGCCHR Clubman Point Scoring System

The Honour Board on the wall in the Clubroom has provision for the yearly Clubman Champion and Sporting Champion.

Every member has the chance to get their name on the board through consistency of participation in Sporting Events or Clubman runs.

Sporting results are kept by the Sporting Director and apply to any MG Club endorsed sporting event that members compete in whether it is a hill climb, motor kana or racetrack event. 1 point allocated for each sporting event a member competes in during the club year.

1st, 2nd and 3rd placings are decided by the total number of points allocated and are rewarded with a trophy. The 1st placing winner's name is listed as the **Sporting Champion** on the Honour Board.

Clubman results are kept by Public Relations Officer (PRO) and are forwarded to him via (A) member responsible for monthly Wednesday mid week pub and club runs, (B) member responsible for monthly Thursday tuning runs, (C) Club Captain responsible for Sunday monthly Clubman runs (D) member responsible for co-ordinating display of MGs at Car Shows or Community Events (unless there are limits on the number of cars that can participate). To qualify for Clubman points members must participate in a minimum of 3, mixed or the same, event runs in the same MG during the club year (July to June).

Depending on what model MG you own and or participate in will decide 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each allocated model division. PRO allocates one point to each driver and mate for each Clubman run for each MG Division. Trophies are awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each MG Division and to the first three MG mates (car partners, wives, girlfriends, boyfriends etc.) The overall winner (the member who participates in the most Clubman runs) wins the Clubman Trophy and has their name listed as the **Clubman Champion** on the Honour Board

Our Club also has a **NON MG** class which is designed to attract members with other marque sports cars to join our club and participate in all runs. PRO allocates one point to each NON MG sports car participating in a run. Members must also participate in a minimum of 3 runs in the same NON MG car to qualify for the trophy. There is only one **NON MG and mate** combined trophy which is awarded to the member with the highest points at the end of the club year.

Although NOT awarded annually the **Octagon Award Trophy** can be awarded by the committee to a NON committee member who in the view of the committee continually assists the MGCCHR with a range of services over the club year.
