Quality of the food was not an issue just so




much to consume.

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

WELCOME TO ALBURY-WODONGA

They're waiting for us in Albury-Wodonga and they've been very patient. Originally the venue for the pandemic-cancelled 2020 National Meeting, the twin cities on the Murray will finally welcome us for Easter 2025. The meeting runs from 18 to 22 April.

We've got a great program of events and venues in mind and planning is well advanced.

THE PROGRAM

To get things started, we will be using a venue in Wodonga called The Cube for our Noggin 'n' Natter and Rocker Cover Racing. You will know how to find it on Friday evening because you'll have been there for Registration and Scrutineering earlier on Good Friday.

The Concours will take place on Easter Saturday at Gateway Lakes Park, on the Victorian bank - rive gauche - of the Murray River. It's a great open space with plenty to do after you've checked out all the cars. The Smith's Tacho Reduction Gearbox.

The early cable-driven tachometers in many cars required a reduction gearbox to adjust the speed of the cable to match the dial reading of the tacho.

Some vehicles had reduction boxes fitted directly to the camshaft and these were a simple 2:1 ratio.

These reduction gearboxes for the MGs are fixed to the rear of the dynamo/generator and are geared down to suit the combined ratio of the specific model's engine speed, dynamo speed and the tachometer. The dynamo pulley is typically smaller than the crankshaft pulley to speed up the charging rate, so spins faster than the engine.

I did not have the correct 'box for the TA and I tried a few suppliers to no avail. By 'no avail', I mean that I could not find a supplier that made, or stocked, the original period-style Smiths units. The offerings were manufactured from a block of steel and were 'chunky', lacking style and the finesse of the original design. However, I had an original item to suit a TC, but it was seized. Since I had nothing to lose, I opened it up to check the problem and whether it was feasible to modify it to suit. The cause of the seizing was that the grease had dried and hardened, locking up the gear meshing, but otherwise everything else was in excellent condition. This is a common problem too, for the grease in wiper motor gearboxes. (If your wiper seems to be running slow and/or hotter than it should, strip it and renew the grease.)

The next problem was to confirm the correct ratio. I had read in the past that the ratio should be 2.66 but the "W.E.Blower" publication for all models up to the TF listed it to be the same as the TC i.e. 2.25. However, "Blower" listed the sister cars, SA and WA, as being 2.66. The missing member of the trio of these beautiful saloons, the VA, had no mention of the tacho, which was probably an inadvertent omission. To confirm what it should be, I checked the ratio by calculating through the pulley sizes and the tacho readout from a known input r.p.m. For the latter, I used an electric drill and infrared digital tacho. I can confirm that the ratio should be 2.66 and therefore "Blower" is in error. (It would not be a sin to use the TC ratio as the only difference would be that the tacho reading would be about 18%, or thereabouts, higher than actual.)

I then searched for some gear manufacturers to see if there was anything compatible for the casing, the shafts, and the ratio. Lo and behold - *Success!* I found a company in the UK that manufactures a mind-boggling array of miniature gears in a range of materials, and I had no problem finding a set of gears with the correct ratio and, importantly the p.c.d. The gears needed modifying as they were too thick and one needed the shaft hole increased to enable a press fit on the original shaft. A colleague is associated with a business that worked with small industrial equipment and instruments and they offered to undertake the machining. I made a workshop drawing to make their job easier. The result is first-class and every bit as good as the original.

The photos below show the original gearbox used, with 2.25 stamped on the case, and the difference between the gear sets. (The shiny ones are the new ones.)

p.s. I believe grease should not be used in these because of its limited lubricating ability in this application. Once the gears have had a decent spin, the grease throws to the outside of the chamber and stays there. Early cars required a heavy oil for chassis lubrication and

I believe these would be better with oil. The early grease guns in car standard tool kits were called 'oil guns' and this is what would have been used on the nipple fitted to these units. In a normal transmission gearbox, the oil sits around the layshaft and as soon as the car moves, the oil is brought up to the mainshaft and circulates. This would be the same. Plus, some oil would get to the shafts, where grease wouldn't.



MGCCHR Clubman Point Scoring System

The Honour Board on the wall in the Clubroom has provision for the yearly Clubman Champion and Sporting Champion.

Every member has the chance to get their name on the board through consistency of participation in Sporting Events or Clubman runs.

Sporting results are kept by the Sporting Director and apply to any MG Club endorsed sporting event that members compete in whether it is a hill climb, motor kana or racetrack event. 1 point allocated for each sporting event a member competes in during the club year.

1st, 2nd and 3rd placings are decided by the total number of points allocated and are rewarded with a trophy. The 1st placing winner's name is listed as the **Sporting Champion** on the Honour Board.

Clubman results are kept by Public Relations Officer (PRO) and are forwarded to him via (A) member responsible for monthly Wednesday mid week pub and club runs, (B) member responsible for monthly Thursday tuning runs, (C) Club Captain responsible for Sunday monthly Clubman runs (D) member responsible for co-ordinating display of MGs at Car Shows or Community Events (unless there are limits on the number of cars that can participate). To qualify for Clubman points members must participate in a minimum of 3, mixed or the same, event runs in the same MG during the club year (July to June).

Depending on what model MG you own and or participate in will decide 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each allocated model division. PRO allocates one point to each driver and mate for each Clubman run for each MG Division. Trophies are awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each MG Division and to the first three MG mates (car partners, wives, girlfriends, boyfriends etc.) The overall winner (the member who participates in the most Clubman runs) wins the Clubman Trophy and has their name listed as the **Clubman Champion** on the Honour Board

Our Club also has a **NON MG** class which is designed to attract members with other marque sports cars to join our club and participate in all runs. PRO allocates one point to each NON MG sports car participating in a run. Members must also participate in a minimum of 3 runs in the same NON MG car to qualify for the trophy. There is only one **NON MG and mate** combined trophy which is awarded to the member with the highest points at the end of the club year.

Although NOT awarded annually the **Octagon Award Trophy** can be awarded by the committee to a NON committee member who in the view of the committee continually assists the MGCCHR with a range of services over the club year.
